



Dear Colleague:

Pursuant to House Rule 25, clause 5(d)(2), the Committee on Ethics hereby approves your and your spouse's proposed trip to Japan,¹ scheduled for August 29 to September 3, 2019, sponsored by American Conservative Union Foundation.

You must complete a Member/Officer Post-Travel Disclosure Form and file it, together with a Sponsor Post-Travel Disclosure Form completed by the trip sponsor, with the Clerk of the House within 15 days after your return from travel. As part of that filing, you are also required to attach a copy of this letter and both the Traveler and Primary Trip Sponsor Forms (including attachments) you previously submitted to the Committee in seeking pre-approval for this trip. You must also report all travel expenses totaling more than \$390 from a single source on the "Travel" schedule of your annual Financial Disclosure Statement covering this calendar year. Finally, Travel Regulation § 404(d) also requires you to keep a copy of all request forms and supporting information provided to the Committee for three subsequent Congresses from the date of travel.

Because the trip may involve meetings with foreign government representatives, we note that House Members may accept, under the Foreign Gifts and Decorations Act (FGDA), gifts "of minimal value [currently \$390] tendered as a souvenir or mark of courtesy" by a foreign government. Any tangible gifts valued in excess of minimal value received from a foreign government must, within 60 days of acceptance, be disclosed on a Form for Disclosing Gifts from Foreign Governments and either turned over to the Clerk of the House, or, with the written approval of the Committee, retained for official use.

¹ Please be aware that the Committee's review of the proposed trip does not extend to either the security situation in the destination country or security related to foreign travel in general. We recommend you contact the Sergeant at Arms (SAA) for a safety and security briefing prior to your departure. SAA may be reached at (202) 226-2044 or ohsstaff@mail.house.gov. Question #4

- Congressman Sensenbrenner has been to Japan dozens of times and is a leading voice on how to strengthen the US-Japan alliance in furtherance of our foreign policy and national security priorities. In addition, he has been a leader on broader foreign policy matters relating to the Asian continent. 【Session 4 About Media and Academia - Can We Protect Our Free Society?】

(Background Aim, Outline)

- In both Japan and the United States, today's elite media is undermining the "freedom of speech," which is the basis of democracy. A method of media is guiding the idea that only the opinions of major theorists of a particular academic society (for example, constitutional science in this case) matter and no other discussions are significant. It tends to disregard dialogues and opinions necessary to improve politics and society. This is shown, for example, in the results of the Asahi Shimbun questionnaire on security laws for constitutionalists.
- Many constitutional scholars have such tendency. For example, Kenji Ishikawa (Professor of the University of Tokyo), Tatsuo Hasebe (Professor of Waseda University), Sota Kimura (Professor of Tokyo Metropolitan University), and others of the Constitution Course of the University of Tokyo Faculty of Law are adamant about how correct they are and neglect to have constitutionalists and security specialists have fair and serious discussions.
- Even in the United States, the movement to suppress the freedom of speech by "political correctness" is severe, and President Trump is trying to break away from this situation through Twitter and such. In J-CPAC 2019, we ask whether media and academia can protect liberal society again in both Japan and the US.

The aftermath of dreams was found a metaphorical dilapidation dominated by ruins and gangs.

[Session 5 Hollowing Out of Industry in Japan]

(Background Aim, Outline)

- After the collapse of the asset-inflated bubble economy, Japanese manufacturing industries started falling into a decline. The Japanese economy which has been in low growth for 20 years was further damaged by the Lehman Shock and the Great East Japan Earthquake and the export competitiveness of its manufacturing capabilities has fallen sharply.
- Furthermore, although there has been a return to the domestic market in recent years, the manufacturing sector has been shifting to overseas production for about the past 30 years. The factors contributing to Japan's manufacturing decline are the appreciation of the yen, rising labor costs, and energy supply problems such as electricity. In addition, with regard to the overseas expansion of companies, it can not be denied that the company has found a way to gain overseas markets in response to saturation and stagnation of domestic demand.
- On the other hand, while the United States has steadily developed the IT industry in the last 20 years, seed creation for new industries from sectors such as military industry is also strong. In this move, President Trump's domestic economic promotion policy is more effective, and the United States has developed a very strong economic recovery.
- Based on various factors theory and business behavior theory, we will discuss the structural cause of Japan's industrial hollowing out and what to aim for the industrial revival with an emphasis on the United States.
