While in El Paso, I participated in a roundtable discussion at Pecan Farm with Ranchers and Farmers to hear firsthand from the farmers and ranchers that have been directly affected by the border crossings and the destruction to their farms. As well as touring the unaccompanied minor facilities in El Paso. Where I had the opportunity to speak with children currently here to better understand the conditions and their everyday experience in these facilities. Additionally, I toured Paso Del Norte Port where I was given an overview of POE enforcement activities and a briefing on the wind down of the Migrant Protection Protocols (MPP) Lastly, Custom and Borders Protection briefed Members on the accomplishments and challenges of the immigration issue through a line tour of key border points.
