Dear Colleague:

Pursuant to House Rule 25, clause 5(d)(2), the Committee on Ethics hereby approves your proposed trip to Bosnia-Herzegovina,¹ scheduled for May 25 to 30, 2021, sponsored by Fellowship Foundation (d.b.a. International Foundation).

This approval represents the Committee's determination that the proposed trip complies with relevant House rules, federal laws, and Travel Regulations promulgated by the Committee. You should engage in your own assessment of the risks and implications of engaging in travel during the current COVID-19 pandemic.

You must complete a Member/Officer Post-Travel Disclosure Form and file it, together with a Sponsor Post-Travel Disclosure Form completed by the trip sponsor, with the Clerk of the House within 15 days after your return from travel. As part of that filing, you are also required to attach a copy of this letter and both the Traveler and Primary Trip Sponsor Forms (including attachments) you previously submitted to the Committee in seeking pre-approval for this trip. You must also report all travel expenses totaling more than \$415 from a single source on the "Travel" schedule of your annual Financial Disclosure Statement covering this calendar year. Finally, Travel Regulation § 404(d) also requires you to keep a copy of all request forms and supporting information provided to the Committee for three subsequent Congresses from the date of travel.

¹ Please be aware that the Committee's review of the proposed trip does not extend to either the security situation in the destination country or security related to foreign travel in general. We recommend you contact the Office of House Security (OHS) for a safety and security briefing prior to your departure. OHS may be reached at (202) 226-2044 or ohsstaff@mail.house.gov. 
Because the trip may involve meetings with foreign government representatives, we note that House Members may accept, under the Foreign Gifts and Decorations Act (FGDA), gifts "of minimal value [currently \$415] tendered as a souvenir or mark of courtesy" by a foreign government. Any tangible gifts valued in excess of minimal value received from a foreign government must, within 60 days of acceptance, be disclosed on a Form for Disclosing Gifts from Foreign Governments and either turned over to the Clerk of the House, or, with the written approval of the Committee, retained for official use.

Congressman Robert Aderholt has been involved with Southeast Europe for many years. Through his long-term involvement in the US National Prayer Breakfast held in Washington, DC every February, Congressman Aderholt has met and gradually made friendships with leaders from many nations. Through his involvement in OSCE (Organization for Security and Co-operation in Europe) and the Helsinki Commission, he has connected with still other leaders in various parts of Europe. As you would expect, many of those leaders come to the US on a regular basis and Congressman Aderholt often makes time available to meet with them and has developed many close relationships.

Congressman Aderholt has traveled to Europe many times to attend OSCE and other gatherings. He has also traveled multiple times with the International Foundation to attend various Southeast European Gatherings in several different countries for the purpose of deepening relationships and strengthening the spiritual basis of many of these relationships. Congressman Aderholt is well known and deeply respected all over Southeast Europe and knows many of the key leaders in each country. His interest in people, his special knowledge of European issues and opportunities and his interest in seeing the people of the region experience a generation of peace and harmony and spiritual development causes him to be especially effective in joining these Annual Gatherings.

Congressman John Moolenaar has worked closely with Congressman Aderholt for the last several years in giving direction to the National Prayer Breakfast in Washington.
