They generate about 1,600 million watts of electricity, which is enough to power the annual needs of more than 900,000 homes. This site is the third largest generating station in Florida and the eleventh largest power plant in the United States. In 2019, Florida Power & Light (FPL) received approval to build 2 more units. We will discuss alternative energy resources and how rising sea levels will contribute to Turkey Points' future.
