Pursuant to House Rule 25, clause 5(d)(2), the Committee on Ethics hereby approves your proposed trip to Egypt, scheduled for November 9 to 13, 2022, sponsored by the Climate Solutions Foundation.

You must complete a Member/Officer Post-Travel Disclosure Form and file it, together with a Sponsor Post-Travel Disclosure Form completed by the trip sponsor, with the Clerk of the House within 15 days after your return from travel. As part of that filing, you are also required to attach a copy of this letter and both the Traveler and Primary Trip Sponsor Forms (including attachments) you previously submitted to the Committee in seeking pre-approval for this trip. You must also report all travel expenses totaling more than \$415 from a single source on the "Travel" schedule of your annual Financial Disclosure Statement covering this calendar year. Finally, Travel Regulation § 404(d) also requires you to keep a copy of all request forms and supporting information provided to the Committee for three subsequent Congresses from the date of travel.

Because the trip may involve meetings with foreign government representatives, we note that House Members may accept, under the Foreign Gifts and Decorations Act (FGDA), gifts "of minimal value [currently \$415] tendered as a souvenir or mark of courtesy" by a foreign government. Any tangible gifts valued in excess of minimal value received from a foreign government must, within 60 days of acceptance, be disclosed on a Form for Disclosing Gifts from Foreign Governments and either turned over to the Clerk of the House, or, with the written approval of the Committee, retained for official use.

Please be aware that the Committee's review of the proposed trip does not extend to either the security situation in the destination country or security related to foreign travel in general. 

The delegation will gather at the Coast International Restaurant for a buffet breakfast. You will be given an overview of what to expect while in Sharm and an overview of the itinerary. David Dumke, Executive Director of Global Perspectives & International Initiatives at the University of Central Florida, will join us to provide additional background information on what to expect while in Egypt and global perspectives on climate change.

Overview of meetings in the Blue Zone, the official meeting center of COP27: You will be meeting with dignitaries from foreign governments, NGO executives, and corporate executives during this time. Please note that governments are aware that you are not part of an official United States Government delegation. Sarah Wiszniak, Program Director of CSF, will be guiding the group through the Blue Zone. She will meet you at the convention center before going through security.

11:30 AM to 12:00 PM

Meeting with Lord Goldsmith, Minister of State for Asia, Energy, Climate and Environment of the United Kingdom

Location: Plenary Hall 1 Terrace, Blue Zone—Area 1

About Lord Goldsmith: Lord Goldsmith of Richmond Park, "Zac" is the scion of billionaire industrialist James Goldsmith and married to Alice Rothschild of the Rothschild banking dynasty. He is a member of the conservative party and served in the House of Commons from 2007 to 2019 when he lost his election. He is a close ally of Boris Johnson who then appointed him to the House of Lords. Until then-Prime Minister Truss fired him, he served as Minister of State with special responsibilities regarding the environment. In the current administration of Prime Minister Sunak, he has been given responsibilities for territories and the Commonwealth.

Today, Lord Goldsmith's agenda reflects his years of work on the environment and his recent responsibilities for territories, and he is likely to raise the need for developed nations to aid less developed nations experiencing the consequences of climate change; particularly those dealing with rising seas.

About the UK's climate agenda: In 2019, the UK pledged to reduce greenhouse gas emissions to netzero by 2050. In addition, then-Prime Minister Boris Johnson committed that the UK's electricity sector will achieve net-zero by 2035. The 2050 commitment is considered "on-track" with Paris Agreement goals to limit global warming to 1.5 degrees Celsius. On the other hand, it is unclear how the UK will meet its goals, particularly the early 2035 goal for the power sector.

The new administration of Prime Minister Sunak has not yet made its climate policies clear. Climate was a major priority for Prime Minister Boris Johnson (and previous conservative prime ministers back to Margaret Thatcher) who viewed the issue as key to expanding the party's base and winning elections. The UK exerted considerable influence on climate in advance of and surrounding last year's COP26 in Glasgow, but its future commitment is uncertain given the recent changes in government.

Meeting with Kara Hurst, Vice President of Worldwide Sustainability at Amazon Location: We Mean Business Pavilion, Blue Zone—Area C Building 5

Kara Hurst will provide the delegation with an overview of Amazon's environmental and sustainability investments around the world.

About Kara Hurst: Kara Hurst leads Worldwide Sustainability at Amazon. Prior to joining Amazon, Kara was CEO of The Sustainability Consortium (TSC) and she worked as Vice President of Business for Social Responsibility (BSR). Hurst also cofounded of the Electronic Industry Citizenship Coalition (EICC, now the Responsible Business Alliance). In her early career, Hurst worked in the offices of Mayor Willie Brown of San Francisco and for the late Senator Daniel Patrick Moynihan (D-NY).

Lunch & Meeting with Yannick Glemarec, Executive Director of the Green Climate Fund Location: GCF & GEF Pavilion, Blue Zone—Area C Building 5

The Green Climate Fund (GCF) was established in 2010 as an independent entity to create a climate finance market in the developing world. The view is that projects in the developing world had little to no access to green investors which would result in climate-friendly projects being set aside for traditional projects. The Green Climate Fund is supposed to provide incremental funding for those projects, but also to create channels for private investment to displace projects that emit more greenhouse gasses. Large projects are in agriculture and reforestation.

The GCF was envisioned as a \$100 billion/year undertaking to be funded by developed countries. To date, a little over \$10 billion has been raised. The United States has committed \$3 billion and provided \$1.5 billion. House Republicans have been critical of using tax dollars for this work. Major groups including Conservation International, World Wildlife and banks including Deutsche Bank ad HSBC partner with the GCF. Yannick Glemarec, the executive director of the GCF with whom you will meet has announced his retirement in March of 2023.

About Yannick Glemarec: Yannick Glemarec is the Executive Director of the Green Climate Fund. Yannick has 30 years of international experience in climate change, development and finance, and their interrelationships, including serving as UN Assistant Secretary-General for Policy and Programme in UN Women, Executive Coordinator of the UN Multi-Partner Trust Fund Office, and UNDP Deputy Executive Coordinator for the Global Environment Facility Administration.
