Meal expenses will be at or below the government per diem rates for Thursday August 3rd and Friday August 4th. We anticipate that the dinner scheduled for Thursday, August 3rd will be slightly higher than per diem rates, around \$40 per person compared to the \$31 dollar per diem allowance. Breakfast and lunch for that day are expected to be provided at costs that meet or are below the per diem rates.

The cost for the dinner on August 3rd is expected to exceed per diem rates because we have been unable to find a venue near the trip hotel or in the downtown Boston area that can accommodate our party for a private dinner at per diem rates. We believe having a private room for the Thursday night dinner will improve the quality of the discussion and presentation that will occur throughout the meal. The average cost of a meal at City Tap House is \$45, higher than the price we were able to secure through negotiation.

We realize that other locations may provide a meal for our group at prices lower than per diem rate, however City Tap House was chosen as our venue for the dinner in order to accommodate our tight schedule and to minimize transportation costs for our attendees.
