Listed on the National Register of Historic Places, construction of the lock and dam began in 1935 and became operational in May 1939. It is equipped with a 1,296 foot long dam structure with three submersible roller gates and 14 submersible tainter gates. The Lock and Dam 25 is operated by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers.

**Donald Danforth Plant Science Center and BRDG Park**

The St. Louis region employs about 28,000 people in the biotechnology field and growing. This is important sector for our region and many have dubbed St. Louis at the “Plant Science Capital of the World.”

The Danforth Plant Science Center opened in 2001 and houses over 200 employees and 175 scientists focused on improving the human condition through plant science. Major research areas include basic plant science discovery and technology development, food security crop improvement and sustainability and next generation bioenergy.

Bio Research & Development Growth (BRDG) Park is located adjacent to the Danforth campus. BRDG Park provides emerging life science and clean-tech startups with the tools and facilities they need to increase their chances of success. BRDG Park is a vital resource for homegrown plant science startup companies and beacon for attracting established companies from across the country and world to St. Louis.

Attendees will receive a tour of Danforth and BRDG Park. Speakers include Sam Fiorello of the Danforth Center and panel discussion with a few of the startup companies located at the campus.

Warren Stemme is a fourth-generation family farmer and lifelong resident of Chesterfield, Mo. He’s also Chairman of Mid-America Biofuels, LLC in Mexico, MO and President of Biofuels LLC, majority owner of Mid-America Biofuels.

With degrees from the University of Missouri in both Agronomy and Agricultural Economics, he’s been active in farm groups his entire career. He’s a current Board member and past President of the St. Louis County Farm Bureau and President of the Howard Bend Levee District. He is past President of the Missouri Soybean Association and past member of the Governor’s Advisory Council on Agriculture as well as the Missouri Energy Leadership Council.

Besides the farm operation itself, what he works at hardest and enjoys most is educating the public about agriculture. Because his farm lies within the St. Louis metropolitan region, he has the opportunity to host farm visits ranging from school groups, to international trade teams, to elected officials from local, state and national governments.

He also hosts groups from companies or organizations who serve farmers but have employees who have never even been on a farm. He finds it personally and professionally rewarding to, as he puts it, “see people connect the dots in the food chain and see what happens where it starts – at the farm.”
