Appendix Relating to Items 4, 10 and 12

House Parliamentarian Thomas J. Wickham, Jr. will conduct a two-hour seminar with the Panetta Institute's congressional interns on Tuesday, August 7, 2018, from 10:15 a.m. to 12:15 p.m. He will arrive in Monterey, California on August 6, 2018, and will depart from Monterey on August 7, 2018.

Mr. Wickham's topic is Parliamentary Procedures: The Structure, Working and Organization of the United States House of Representatives. He will arrive fifteen minutes in advance to prepare the classroom and remain for a short time afterward to answer individual questions.

The Panetta Institute's Congressional Internship Program begins with an intensive, two-week academic course at the Panetta Institute. As part of this course, the Institute brings together more than thirty local, state, and national leaders as well as experts on immigration, education, the budget, the economy, climate change, energy policy, health care and other issues who lead sessions during the orientation. Mr. Wickham will speak to the students in a session explaining how the United States House of Representatives functions. Following completion of the orientation, each intern is assigned to a Capitol Hill office of a member of the California congressional delegation to work for two and one-half months. In Washington, the students perform typical intern duties. They will also attend special seminars with present and former members of Congress; former and current Cabinet members; White House officials; and policy experts. The congressional interns are nominated by the presidents of each of the twenty-three California State University campuses, as well as three private post-secondary schools. Once nominated, an in-person interview by Panetta Institute staff and a representative of the CSU Chancellor's office takes place. All students receive background investigations.
