- 6:17 a.m. – 8:54 a.m. JetBlue Flight from DCA to FLL
- 9:00 a.m. Transport to hotel to check-in and store baggage.
- 9:30 a.m. Travel to Port Everglades from Hotel
- 10:00 a.m. – 12:00 p.m. Waterside Tour of Port Everglades – this will include a discussion on the current status and operations of the Ft. Lauderdale Coast Guard Station, and construction dredging by the Army Corps. Tour will also include waterside tour of cargo and cruise operations at the port. This will allow staff an understanding of the importance of navigational harbor maintenance and Coast Guard operations.
