Florida East Coast Industries and *Virgin Trains USA* cordially invite you to participate in a senior staff delegation trip to South Florida August 22-23 to experience the new *Virgin Trains USA* express intercity passenger rail system connecting Miami, Fort Lauderdale and West Palm Beach. This educational trip will provide background on the history and development of the project, a travel experience and tour of our state-of-the-art trains and passenger stations, and an understanding of the impact this system has had on South Florida's economy.

Your itinerary will include briefings on *Virgin Trains*' grade crossing safety infrastructure and technology enhancements, including Positive Train Control (PTC). It will also include a comprehensive overview of our station security and passenger screening systems and our public safety education program through Operation Lifesaver.

In addition you will have an opportunity to tour our state-of-the-art railcar maintenance facility and experience our new "Buy America" Siemens built locomotives and passenger cars. *Virgin Trains USA* is the one of the first U.S. rail systems to receive these new "Charger" locomotives, which meet EPA Tier IV emission standards.

This trip, which includes one overnight stay, will familiarize key Congressional staff on the planned extension to Orlando, now under construction, and our next *Virgin Trains USA* project connecting Las Vegas to Southern California.
