Pursuant to House Rule 25, clause 5(d)(2), the Committee on Ethics hereby approves your proposed trip to Cyprus,¹ scheduled for September 14 to 19, 2021, sponsored by United Nations Foundation.

This approval represents the Committee's determination that the proposed trip complies with relevant House rules, federal laws, and Travel Regulations promulgated by the Committee. You should engage in your own assessment of the risks and implications of engaging in travel during the current COVID-19 pandemic.

You must complete an Employee Post-Travel Disclosure Form (which your employing Member must also sign) and file it, together with a Sponsor Post-Travel Disclosure Form completed by the trip sponsor, with the Clerk of the House within 15 days after your return from travel. As part of that filing, you are also required to attach a copy of this letter and both the Traveler and Primary Trip Sponsor Forms (including attachments) you previously submitted to the Committee in seeking pre-approval for this trip. If you are required to file an annual Financial Disclosure Statement, you must also report all travel expenses totaling more than \$415 from a single source on the "Travel" schedule of your annual Financial Disclosure Statement covering this calendar year. Finally, Travel Regulation § 404(d) also requires you to keep a copy of all request forms and supporting information provided to the Committee for three subsequent Congresses from the date of travel.

¹ Please be aware that the Committee's review of the proposed trip does not extend to either the security situation in the destination country or security related to foreign travel in general. We recommend you contact the Office of House Security (OHS) for a safety and security briefing prior to your departure. OHS may be reached at (202) 226-2044 or ohsstaff@mail.house.gov. House travelers should also register for the U.S. State Department's Smart Traveler Enrollment Program at https://step.state.gov.

Because the trip may involve meetings with foreign government representatives, we note that House employees may accept, under the Foreign Gifts and Decorations Act (FGDA), gifts "of minimal value [currently \$415] tendered as a souvenir or mark of courtesy" by a foreign government. Any tangible gifts valued in excess of minimal value received from a foreign government must, within 60 days of acceptance, be disclosed on a Form for Disclosing Gifts from Foreign Governments and either turned over to the Clerk of the House, or, with the written approval of the Committee, retained for official use.

12. Description of the sponsor's interest in the subject matter of the trip and its role in organizing and/or conducting the trip:

The United Nations Foundation (UNF) works to educate all Americans, including the U.S. Congress, on the importance of a strong U.S.-UN relationship. This learning trip provides an opportunity for policymakers to observe UN peacebuilding and peacekeeping efforts in Cyprus—one of the world's most intractable political conflicts. While UNFICYP is among the longest-serving UN peacekeeping missions, its continued presence is critical to stability in the Eastern Mediterranean. Through UNFICYP and the Secretary-General's Good Offices, the UN preserves international peace and security, contributes to the maintenance and restoration of law and order, and supports the conduct of negotiations between the Greek Cypriot and Turkish Cypriot leaders. These small investments (UNFICYP is the second least expensive peacekeeping mission) have helped prevent a return to the violence and volatility that broke out across Cyprus in 1974.

UNF is the sole sponsor of this trip, organizing all aspects of the program and logistics. UNF handles all outreach to congressional staff and is the contact for planning purposes.

15b2. Provide the reason for selecting the location of the event or trip:

The United Nations Peacekeeping Force in Cyprus (UNFICYP) was established in 1964 to prevent further fighting between the Greek Cypriot and Turkish Cypriot communities on the island and bring about a return to normal conditions. The mission's responsibilities expanded in 1974, following a coup d'etat by elements favoring union with Greece and a subsequent military intervention by Turkey. Since a de facto ceasefire in 1974, UNFICYP has supervised the ceasefire lines; provided humanitarian assistance; and maintained a buffer zone between the Turkish and Turkish Cypriot forces in the north and the Greek Cypriot forces in the south.

While the mission has successfully prevented major hostilities following the events of 1974, recent political developments make this a critical moment for the future of UNFICYP's work. During UN-led talks in April 2021, Turkish-Cypriot leader Ersin Tatar formally proposed a two-state solution to the island's conflict, jeopardizing the prospects for a bizonal, bicommunal federation, which has been the long-standing position of the UN Security Council. Additionally, on July 20, 2021, Turkish Cypriot authorities and Turkey announced plans to revert a 1.35 square-mile section of Varosha—an abandoned southern quarter of the city of Famagusta—from military to civilian control and open it for potential resettlement. This action would violate several UN Security Council resolutions.

Over the course this trip, the delegation will learn about what these serious developments mean for UNFICYP, stability on the island, and the future of the overall Cyprus peace process. The delegation will meet with Elizabeth Spehar, Special Representative of the Secretary-General and Head of UNFICYP; Major General Ingrid Gjerde, UNFICYP Force Commander; U.S. Amb. Judith G. Garber; Greek Cypriot and Turkish Cypriot authorities; members of civil society, and more. The delegation will, in addition, visit various sections of the 111-mile-long buffer zone that UN peacekeeping forces regularly patrol to prevent escalatory actions.
