Dear Mr. Madsen:

Pursuant to House Rule 25, clause 5(d)(2), the Committee on Ethics hereby approves your proposed trip to Williamsburg, Virginia, scheduled for October 13 to 15, 2021, sponsored by Congressional Institute.
