From 2005 to 2009, he was Chief of Staff in the Secretary of State's Office of Policy Planning at the U.S. State Department. He also spent two years as Senior Advisor in the Department's Office of International Religious Freedom, where he specialized in religious freedom in the Middle East. Todd worked for a decade in the U.S. Congress, including six years as Chief of Staff to Senator Tim Hutchinson.



Dr. Steven Garber served at Regent College from 2017–2020 as Professor of Marketplace Theology and Leadership and as Director of Regent's Master of Arts in Leadership, Theology, and Society. Prior to his time at Regent, he served as Principal of The Washington Institute for Faith, Vocation, and Culture in Washington, D.C.



Cherie Harder serves as President of the Trinity Forum (<https://www.tff.org/>). Prior to joining the Trinity Forum in 2008, Ms. Harder served in the White House as Special Assistant to the President and Director of Policy and Projects for First Lady Laura Bush. She previously served on the board of Gordon College and the C.S. Lewis Institute, and is a current board member of the Convergence Center for Policy Resolution and Faith and Law. She also serves on the advisory boards of the Democracy Fund and the National Museum of American Religion.



Jay Jakub serves as the Economics of Mutuality Movement (<https://eom.org/>)'s chief advocacy officer after nearly 14 years in the Mars global headquarters. Jay is a frequent keynote speaker and panelist at forums, business conferences and other gatherings, guest lecturing on EoM at leading universities around the world. He is the co-author of the EoM book, *Completing Capitalism*, and is a contributing co-author to the forthcoming book, *Putting Purpose into Practice: The Economics of Mutuality*.



D.J. Jordan is a Senior Vice President at Pinkston (<https://pinkston.co/>). Prior to joining Pinkston, D.J. was communications director for a U.S. Senator, communications director for the U.S. House Committee on Small Business, and press secretary for a U.S. Representative.
