- 4. Derek Luyten, Executive Director of the House Democracy Partnership (HDP), and Justin Wein, Chief of Staff to Representative David Price (D-NC) have been invited to travel to Los Angeles, California to attend the Parliamentary Gathering on the Occasion of the Ninth Summit of the Americas from June 5-8, 2022, inclusive of travel. This exchange will bring together legislators from the Latin American and Caribbean region as an opportunity to discuss inclusive democratic engagement, creating a sustainable future through democracy, countering disinformation, and creating space for women's engagement in the legislature. As the Executive Director for HDP, and with a strong background in democracy and governance, Mr. Luyten will be able to provide insights from the institutional perspective of HDP as well as the importance of the role of the legislature in effective and resilient democracies. As Chief of Staff to the Chairman of HDP, Mr. Wein has a comprehensive understanding of HDP and the commission's relationships with partner parliaments worldwide. Both Mr. Luyten and Mr. Wein will participate in the conference and report back to HDP and Chairman Price about potential avenues for future assistance within the Americas as it relates to HDP. Further, in response to two recent CODELs that were conducted by HDP in the Latin America and Caribbean region, this program serves as a follow-on opportunity to continue discussions between and among members and staff involved in efforts to strengthen cooperation between the U.S. and the region.
- 12. The House Democracy Partnership (HDP) is a bipartisan, twenty-member commission of the U.S. House of Representatives that works directly with more than 20 countries from around the world to support the development of effective, independent, and responsive legislative institutions. The National Democratic Institute (NDI), in collaboration with the International Republican Institute (IRI) facilitates programming on behalf of HDP, which complements both institutions' respective legislative strengthening work with parliaments worldwide, including parliaments in Latin America. NDI will coordinate with its partners at IRI, in addition to ParlAmericas in organizing this event, but will be responsible for funding and coordinating logistics related to the program, including scheduling meetings, providing travel and accommodation arrangements, and defining the program methodology. USAID has provided grant funds to NDI for this purpose.

2) Los Angeles, California is the host city of the Ninth Summit of the Americas, taking place from June 6-10, 2022, and will bring together a wide array of stakeholders, including heads of state and government, civil society, and the private sector to discuss common policy issues and challenges faced in the Americas. In advance of the Summit, NDI in collaboration with IRI and in partnership with ParlAmericas, will host an HDP pre-conference June 6-7 in order to bring together legislators from across the Americas to discuss democratic engagement and strengthening, and how legislators can work to support and enhance the summit themes of health and resilience in the Americas; promoting a green future; accelerating the transition to clean energy; digital transformation; and strengthened democratic governance.
