

Purpose of Tour Location

Question 15.b.2) Provide the reason for selecting the location of the event or trip:.

New Orleans was chosen because of the proximity of the airport to 4 major facilities that offer a look at different aspects of the advanced biofuels sector. These include the production of renewable diesel; soybean processing and grain export; storage and piping of fats and oils – such as soybean oil – to locations for processing; and grain handling and import/export via river transport on the Mississippi.

Attachment B – Description of Meetings and Events Attended

Welcome and Overview – Representatives from the Clean Fuels Alliance Foundation, along with stakeholders from the renewable diesel and biodiesel sectors, provided trip participants with an overview of the industry and relevant issues. Their powerpoint presentation described the state of the industry, technical details about fuel types and production, and relevant federal policies. This meeting took place in the hotel conference room where we had spent the prior night.

Diamond Green Diesel – We were transported by bus from the hotel to the Diamond Green Diesel facility, where we listened to a presentation from the plant managers. We learned about the plant's capacity, ongoing operations, and how federal policy is guiding their plans for the future.

Bunge Chevron Ag Renewables – We were given a tour of the facility, which processes soybeans for different uses, including for renewable fuel production. We toured part of the facility on foot, and were also shown their dock facility where they load barges with exported product.

IMTT Terminal – We were given a bus tour of the complex, where we saw their fuel storage tanks. These tanks are used for storing different types of fuel and fuel feedstocks, such as soybean oil. We then went to a former schoolhouse, which is on the IMTT campus, for lunch and a presentation from IMTT employees about the facility's operations. After the presentation, we participated in a roundtable discussion, moderated by the Clean Fuels Alliance, about biofuels.

ADM ARTCO – The last tour stop was a river transport company that operates a fleet of barges, tugs, and crew boats that manage grain handling, storage, import, and export. We heard from company employees about their sustainability goals and challenges, received a demonstration of their machinery, and were taken on a river boat tour to see operations.
