The tour provides participants with a better understanding of the environmental and economic impacts of biodiesel, renewable diesel, and sustainable aviation fuel and supports each sponsor's efforts to create a positive legislative environment. Each of the sponsors listed here have made financial contributions to the tour and have been part of organizing and conducting the tour.

Clean Fuels Alliance Foundation works closely with the Clean Fuels Alliance America to address issues affecting the nation -- cleaner air, greater economic development for rural communities, and enhanced national security through energy independence. If you are required to file an annual Financial Disclosure Statement, you must also report all travel expenses totaling more than \$480 from a single source on the "Travel" schedule of your annual Financial Disclosure Statement covering this calendar year. Finally, Travel Regulation § 404(d) also requires you to keep a copy of all request forms and supporting information provided to the Committee for three subsequent Congresses from the date of travel.
