Welcome & Overview (10 minutes)- Tom Verry, Executive Director Clean Fuels Foundation

Biodiesel 101 & Industry Update (15 minutes)– Paul Winters, Director of Public Affairs and Federal Communication, Clean Fuels Alliance America. Paul will give participants an overview of the biodiesel industry and the federal and state policies that support its growth, such as the Renewable Fuel Standard (RFS) and tax credit.

New York City's Current and Future Use of Biodiesel (30 minutes)- Keith Kerman, Deputy Commissioner, Chief Fleet Officer, City of New York/Department of Citywide Administrative Services will help participants understand how biodiesel use benefits the largest and most high-profile municipal fleet program in the United States. Keith coordinates with major agencies, including Police, Fire, and Sanitation, to direct all aspects of fleet operations for the city, including repair, acquisitions, sustainability, fuel, contracting, emergency, safety, and risk management.

Clean Cities Update – (30 minutes) Joy Gardner Executive Director of Empire Clean Cities, and Clean Cities and Communities Coalition Coordinator for New York City and the Lower Hudson Valley. She will discuss the region's programs and plans for reducing emissions and how biodiesel and renewable diesel can be a part of the mix.

Marine Biodiesel Demand – (30 minutes) Bill Fitch has an extensive background in the marine industry and is working with Clean Fuels to develop the marine biodiesel market in New York Harbor and the surrounding area.

Industry Roundtable – (30 minutes) Biodiesel producers will discuss the importance of federal and state policies. Participants will learn how the industry has grown since the implementation of key federal policies

and what happens to businesses when the policies are unstable. Panelists include: **Biodiesel producers (TBD)**

Questions and Answer Session (20 minutes)- Moderated by Tom Verry, Executive Director Clean Fuels Foundation.

The New York City Fire Department is the largest municipal fire department in the United States and the second largest in the world, after the Tokyo Fire Department. The FDNY employs approximately 11,051 uniformed firefighters and 4,414 uniformed EMTs, paramedics, and Fire Inspectors to serve more than 8 million residents within a 322-square mile area. Participants will learn why FDNY chose to use low blends of biodiesel over the last several years and looks to expand its use in the future. The facility maintains almost 1,000 pieces of equipment. Fireman Ladder 4 Paul Fischetti will guide the tour through the station.
