Each tour sponsor is directly involved in the production and/or distribution of biodiesel, renewable diesel, and/or sustainable aviation fuel or is involved in the production of biofuel feedstock. The tour provides participants with a better understanding of the environmental and economic impacts of biodiesel, renewable diesel, and sustainable aviation fuel and supports each sponsor's efforts to create a positive legislative environment. Each of the sponsors listed here have made financial contributions to the tour and have been part of organizing and conducting the tour.

- 1. Clean Fuels Alliance Foundation** works closely with the Clean Fuels Alliance America to address issues affecting the nation -- cleaner air, greater economic development for rural communities, and enhanced national security through energy independence. Organized in 1994, the Foundation's mission is to accomplish outreach, education, research, and demonstration activities for the advancement of biodiesel and its co-products to improve rural economic development, national security, air quality and the environment. **The Foundation is the primary tour sponsor and has overall responsibility for planning, organizing, and implementing the tour.**
- 2. ADM (Archer Daniels Midland Company).** Headquartered in Chicago, ADM is one of the world's largest companies in the field of food technology. ADM is also a leading producer of transport biofuels, in particular bioethanol and biodiesel produced from vegetable oils in the EU, Brazil, Canada, and the U.S. The company has an ambitious goal of meeting the world's energy needs with the help of biofuels. In June 2022, ADM broke ground, in partnership with Marathon Petroleum Corp., on North Dakota's first dedicated soybean processing facility which will provide feedstock for 75 million gallons per year of renewable diesel. 

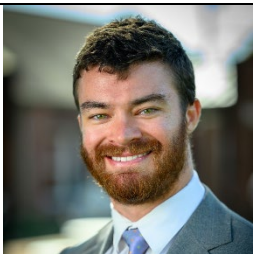

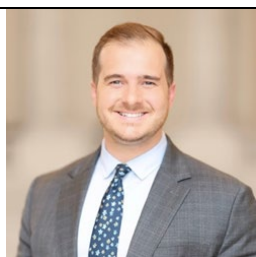

If you are required to file an annual Financial Disclosure Statement, you must also report all travel expenses totaling more than \$480 from a single source on the "Travel" schedule of your annual Financial Disclosure Statement covering this calendar year. Finally, Travel Regulation § 404(d) also requires you to keep a copy of all request forms and supporting information provided to the Committee for three subsequent Congresses from the date of travel.
