Discussions will include the current Bureau of Land Management Travel Management process and the recent issues that have come up between the federal government, state government, Utah Congressional Delegation, and local sentiment. The goal for this overflight is to see the boundaries of protected and unprotected lands, federal/state/private lands, and the interplay between management agencies, and what can be done to address these issues.

Drive back along river road to view uranium tailings clean up, discuss Mining Law of 1972 and public liabilities and ecological threats. This goal of this portion of the trip is to show how complicated things can be when it comes to land management when dealing with multiple agencies and what can be done to address these issues.

The goal of being on the river is to view places not easily accessible that are proposed for wilderness designation. Additionally, we will discuss the principles of "wilderness" when it comes to the definitions provided in the Wilderness Act of 1964 and the Federal Lands Policy and Management Act of 1976, especially relating to the idea of "solitude".
