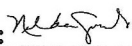

Dear Mr. Rogers:

Pursuant to House Rule 25, clause 5(d)(2), the Committee on Ethics hereby approves your proposed trip to Boulder, Colorado, scheduled for June 16 to 18, 2026, sponsored by NCTA - The Internet and Television Association. Staffers will have an opportunity to speak with NCTA President & CEO Cory Gardner about the cable television and broadband industry.

9:15 – 10:30 AM Tour of Table Mountain - ITS Field Site (1 hr. 15 min.)

Staffers will visit NTIA's Table Mountain Field Site and Radio Quiet Zone, an open-air test facility for research on radio spectrum technologies. During the visit, staffers will observe NTIA's 5G communications testbed, troposcatter measurement systems, radio-wave propagation infrastructure, and mmWave 5G platforms used to advance spectrum access and coexistence. The visit will also include a discussion on advancements in coexistence techniques and approaches, including NTIA's role in coordinating with federal incumbent systems. NTIA will provide an overview of its testing and research activities conducted at Table Mountain.

12:00 – 1:30 PM Lunch * and Presentation at Comcast Denver HQs (1 hr. 30 min.)

Staffers will learn about Comcast's broadband network (Xfinity) and how AI and machine learning are used to automate operations, optimize performance, and enhance the customer experience. These systems improve network efficiency by analyzing data to allocate resources and identify issues more quickly and effectively. The presentation will also cover key elements of network security architecture, including measures to protect both core infrastructure and customer home networks.

2:00 – 3:15 PM Inside Charter's Network Evolution (1 hr. 15 min.)

Staffers will participate in a discussion on Charter's network evolution, which enables a seamless, converged connectivity experience both in and out of the home, with Wi-Fi serving as the bridge between its wireline and wireless networks. The discussion will also highlight how this approach supports increased competition in the mobile marketplace. Staffers will then take a guided tour of the lab to experience demonstrations, including next-generation multi-gigabit Wi-Fi capabilities made possible by expanded access to unlicensed spectrum and ongoing technology innovations.

NCTA is the principal trade association for the cable television and broadband industry. The cable industry employs at least 300 individuals in each invitee's Congressional district. Attendance by Congressional staff on this trip provides the best opportunity to demonstrate the industry's significance to the U.S. economy, innovation and job growth. In addition, staffers will gain a greater understanding of the importance of radio spectrum to the video, broadband, and wireless services that NCTA members provide millions of Americans.

NCTA is the sole organizer and planner of this trip and all the events associated with the trip. NCTA worked with its member companies to arrange the tours of their facilities and to determine availability of the facilities and staff for tours, presentations, and other planned events.
